Networking is the key to successful career endeavors I believe my career development back ground and teaching students to think strategically about their careers will be a benefit to the organization. With my last position at the Community College of Denver we did a research study showing that students who had been seen in our office at a significantly higher rate of retention as compared to the institution (ours was 74%, while the institutions is in the 50%). The majority of the students seen in our office were Latino, so we were helping retain that population of students at the Community College of Denver.
